

Timeline

- October 2019-December 2019
 - Developing research methodology, scheduling interviews, soliciting input from wide variety of stakeholders
- January 2020-August 2020
 - Field work (interviews and convenings) with trustees, presidents, legislators, local business leaders, and other community members
- August 2020-January 2021
 - Information synthesis and report writing

February 2021- Report publication
